Tennessee's population grew 656,822 or 11.5 percent to 6,346,105 between the 2000 and 2010 Censuses. This compares to a 9.7 percent growth rate for the nation as a whole. The South grew at the fastest pace of any region in the US—14.3 percent, fueled principally by growth in Texas and Florida. In fact, four of the eight states gaining seats in the United States House of Representatives are southern states: Texas, Florida, Georgia, and South Carolina.

Annual population growth was not constant over the ten-year period. Changes in the population can be explained by two factors: natural increase and net migration, both from abroad and from other states. The natural increase in population—the surplus of births over deaths—varies slightly but has remained fairly close to 25,000 people per year. Net migration, on the other hand, varies significantly according to variations in the economic cycle. A positive net migration results from more people moving into the state than moved out. Estimates of net migration peaked in 2006 at 67,000. By 2011, net migration had declined to 24,275.

The older population in Tennessee grew an astounding 21.3 percent from 2000 to 2010. This outpaces the US 2000 to 2010 growth rate of 15.1 percent. These trends were evident in spite of the fact that the baby boom generation did not begin to enter the 65-plus cohort until 2011. The proportion of the population 65 and over in Tennessee is 13.4 percent, compared to a national proportion of 13.0 percent.

If the future of Tennessee rests with its children, the state faces a mixed bag of trends. The growth rate from 2000 to 2010 was much less for children than for the population as a whole, coming in at 7.0 percent. However, this growth rate compares quite favorably with the national rate of just 2.6 percent. Of the 97,480 more children in Tennessee in 2010 compared to 2000, 69,154 or 71 percent of them were of Hispanic origin. In the US, the non-Hispanic, under-18 population actually decreased by 2.9 million or 4.8 percent from 2000 to 2010. The 38.8 percent increase in the number of Hispanic children over that period bolstered the nation's growth rate of the under-18 population to 2.6 percent.

The 2010 US Census form only asked 10 questions about age, gender, race, ethnicity, family status, and type of dwelling. As a result, the decennial census contains relatively little information about our nation—only those elements mandated by law for redistricting. To find other information about Americans, for example income, home values, and education, we rely on the American Community Survey. The Census Bureau created the American Community Survey on a limited basis in 2001 to collect information from households around the country. ACS data we released every year allowed a much more current and reliable set of estimates exists to meet the needs of policy makers, researchers, journalists, teachers, students, businesses, and non-governmental organization. Data on median income, home values and education in this report come from the American Community Survey 2006-10 5-year estimates.

In 2010, Tennessee ranked 45th in median household income, with the nearby states of Mississippi, West Virginia, Arkansas, Kentucky, and Alabama exhibiting lower incomes. In 2000, median income in Tennessee was \$36,360 and for the US it was \$41,994. In 2010 those figures were \$43,314 for Tennessee and \$51,914 for the US. Thus Tennessee median household income fell from 86.6 percent of the U.S. median in 2000, to 83.4 percent of the U.S. in 2010.

The midpoint of home values in Tennessee was \$134,100, 71.2 percent of the US median value of \$188,400. Tennessee was tied with South Carolina at 35th place in median home values.

In 2010, 85.6 percent of Americans 25 years or older had completed high school in 2010 compared with 83.6 percent of Tennesseans. In 2000, the gap was wider—80.4 percent of Americans versus 75.9 percent of Tennesseans. For college graduates, the gap has remained fairly constant over the past 10 years. In 2000, 19.6 percent of Tennesseans and 24.4 percent of Americans had a bachelor's degree or higher. In 2010, the figures were 23.1 percent in Tennessee and 28.2 percent in the US.
